Speaker Information-

Since December 2011, Matt has been the team lead for the NWS New Orleans/Baton Rouge Impact-Based Decision Support Pilot Project. This is one of the six NWS Pilot Projects as part of the Weather-Ready Nation Initiative which employs the newly-created Emergency Response Specialist positions. Our purpose is to provide impact-based decision support services to our federal, state, and local government partners for major planned and unplanned events such as a tropical cyclone, oil spill, or chemical release in which the need exists to protect public safety as part of the NWS core mission.

Matt had a great opportunity to become involved in a new NWS pilot program last year, and he relocated to the New Orleans area to become more involved in decision support services.

Please come out and support the Houston AMS as we get a chance to hear about Matt's experiences with the new project. I think many meteorologists are being asked to expand their role from traditional forecasting to include helping others make good decisions when faced with significant weather. Therefore, I think this topic will generate some great discussion opportunities within our group.

Our focus is decision support in a marine environment. The team will enhance this type of support through incorporating new technology, leveraging research being accomplished throughout NOAA, developing an enhanced IDSS-oriented training plan, bringing in social science, and forming an impacts catalog and NIMS-compliant playbook which will document our best practices. Our team has already deployed for several major events including Hurricane Isaac, Navy Week in New Orleans, and Final Four weekend in New Orleans.

From 1998 through 2011 Matt was at the NWS Houston/Galveston Office where he was employed as both a Senior Forecaster and General Forecaster. He has worked closely with the NWS tropical program for the last several years. Matt is part of the NWS Storm Surge Warning Team and the Tropical (HLS) Improvement Team, and has worked to improve tropical training in the agency, including the development of a Tropical Training Short Course at NHC (June 2012) and training simulations on Hurricane Rita and Hurricane Ike. Matt is a graduate of the University of Oklahoma School of Meteorology, Class of 1996.
